



Lakeside Union School District
District English Learner Advisory Council (DELAC)
March 18, 2019 Meeting

Called to order at 3:32 by Sra. Lopez, Chairperson. Absent Members: many absent, no quorum informational meeting only. Minutes from the January 14 meeting could not be approved, will bring to May meeting.

Agenda Items Discussed:

- Kelly discussed the Parent Involvement policy which requires districts receiving Title I money to review and update their policy annually. The DAC committee will be revising the policy in compliance with new federal language guidelines. It will be presented to the DELAC committee in May prior to being approved by Board of Trustees.
- Kelly discussed the recommendations for the new reclassification process. The state has not given final determination for what districts may use to determine if a student has met the English acquisition requirements to be considered proficient. For this year the state is mandating an Overall Performance Level of a 4 (Well Developed) and all other factors may be determined locally. The following criteria will be used for this year only:
 - Grades 3rd - 8th students must reach Level 4 Overall Performance on the ELPAC Summative test and reach *Standards Nearly Met* on the SBAC English Language Arts test. The district will not include Math scores from the SBAC test (change from last year). Teacher and Parent recommendations (same as last year).
 - In grades K – 2nd students must reach Level 4 Overall Performance on the ELPAC Summative test and reach *At Grade level or Above Grade level* on all assessed skill areas in DIBELS (same as last year). Teacher and Parent recommendations (same as last year).
- Kelly explained the state is looking for districts to participate in a pilot test for ELPAC next year, similar to how students currently take the SBAC test. Students would be required to take both paper version and the electronic version. Students would be pulled at random to participate, the district would receive some additional funding if they participate.
 - Kelly asked the group their opinions. After much discussion it appears both the parents and the ELL Assistants are in favor of participating. ELL Assistants will go back and discuss with other English Learner parents and report back to Kelly.
- The district is reviewing and updating the By-laws that govern the committee, they were last updated in 1996. A copy of the by-laws were presented as a first reading. The district will have them translated into Spanish and bring both to the next meeting for a second reading prior to approving/adopting any changes.
- **Agenda items for next meeting:** review new Parent Involvement policy, review By-laws update, vote to approve Redesignation criteria for 2018-2019 school year.
