



At A Glance









Local COVID Case Rates - Lakeside, 92040





Remember: Close contact means a minimum 14 day quarantine

Staff	3	+9 (12 total)	+28 (40 total)


How often are students and staff reporting **symptoms of COVID**?




How often are students and staff reporting **COVID+?**Remember: COVID+ means a minimum 10 day isolation


of POSITIVE COVID CASES





Challenges Posed by Positive Cases, Close Contacts, and Exclusions due to Symptoms


LUSD Leave Summary from First Day of School (n=165)




COVID Leaves by Reason (n=147)

Leaves and the Impact on Critical Staffing



There are 127 Substitutes Teachers in LUSD System

- Only 20 have worked in the past 3 months
- Some have restrictions and only want to work at certain schools and/or take specific assignments (I.e. Elementary vs. Middle School)
- Others are working short/long term sub positions in LUSD or other school districts

LUSD Classroom/School Closures

October 2020:

• State Preschool Program: 4 classes moved to DL for 2 weeks

November 2020:

- Winter Gardens: Moved 5 classes to DL (11/30-12/4)
- Lakeside Farms: Moved one class, Cohort A to DL on 11/30&12/1

December 2020:

- Wintergardens: Moved school to DL (12/4-12/18)
- LEAPP Tuition Based Preschool: Moved 1 class to DL (12/7-12/18)
- Tierra del Sol: Moved class serving students with Moderate/Severe Disabilities to DL (12/8-12/18)
- Riverview: Moved 1 class, Cohort A to DL (12/14 and 12/15)
- Lindo Park: Moved school to DL (12/14-12/18)
- Lemon Crest: Moved class serving students with Moderate/Severe Disabilities to DL (12/14-12/18)

Considerations when making decisions about class/school closures

CLASS CLOSURE

- Consider total number of cases in the class
- Consider number of students in the class identified as close contacts and requiring quarantine
- Consider impact to staffing of the class

SCHOOL CLOSURE

- Consider total number of cases in the school. Does it approach or meet the PH threshold of 5%?
 Can we predict that the threshold will be met?
- Consider impact to staffing issues at the school
- Consult with Public Health

Recommendation for January

Goals:

- 1. Avoid prolonged closures and transmission amongst students and staff
- 2. Minimize disruptions to families and staff due to abrupt school closures

Recommendation:

- → Schedule 2-week distance learning for all LUSD students
 - ♦ Weeks of Jan. 4 & Jan. 11, 2021
 - Resume in-person instruction Tuesday, January 19, 2021
