

Measure L Tax Rate Projections*





RANDOM SURVEY OF LIKELY VOTERS CONDUCTED IN JULY 2019






Do you have or have you ever had any children or grandchildren who attend or are now attending a school in the Lakeside Union School District?





PERCEPTION OF EDUCATION QUALITY


In your opinion, is the education at the schools in your community headed in the right direction or the wrong direction?

Either from what you know or what you've heard, would you rate the quality of education provided by Lakeside Union School District as excellent, good, fair or poor?



How would you rate the quality of fiscal responsibility of the Lakeside Union School District compared to the quality of fiscal responsibility in the surrounding communities?








VIEWS ON PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

Do you agree or disagree that...Our local public schools are our community's most important asset and should be our number one priority.








VIEWS ON SCHOOLS IMPACT ON PROPERTY VALUES

Quality Schools Increase Property Values






BALLOT LANGUAGE: (BEFORE INFORMATION)







Would you be more likely or less likely to vote for the bond if you knew that the tax rate would be...








