JOB SUMMARY:

Under the direction of Director-Maintenance Operations & Transportation, lead and perform a wide variety of skilled and specialized work in an assigned mechanical trade area involving the maintenance, alteration, construction, installation and repair of District buildings, equipment and related structures; serve as the district's systems analyst for building automation systems, energy management system (EMS), lighting systems, smoke/fire detection systems, security camera surveillance systems and power distribution services; perform assigned trade work in conformance with applicable District, building, safety and safety codes and regulations; perform work independently or in collaboration with a maintenance crew; perform duties assigned to the Skilled Maintenance Worker position.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Lead and perform a wide variety of skilled and specialized work in an assigned mechanical trade area involving the maintenance, alteration, construction, installation and repair of District buildings, equipment and related structures.
- Serve as the district's systems analyst for building automation systems, energy management system (EMS), lighting systems, smoke/fire detection systems, security camera surveillance systems and power distribution services.
- Install, replace, repair and test heating and air conditioning systems; install heaters, ventilation systems and equipment; change motors, install sensors and meters; conduct routine overhaul and cleaning ventilation systems/equipment; repair, pack and replace valves, gauges and fittings.
- Operate, repair and maintain boilers; maintains proper steam pressure and water levels, cleans, oils and adjust boiler equipment.
- Inspect and adjust motors, valves, switches, pumps, regulators and filters to maintain proper operating efficiency.
- Operate, repair and maintain condensers, circulating pumps, gas and safety valves, bearings, gauges and sensors.
- Inspect and perform tests on HVAC systems and equipment to identify defective parts and assure proper functioning.
- Light pilots; clean out vents; inspect, maintain, operate and repair pneumatic and electrical thermostats and control
- Operate, repair and maintain ventilation systems including thermostats and related control devices; clean, oil, grease and replace worn parts on heating and ventilation equipment.
- Perform a variety of technical duties involved in the management, repair, replacement, and programming of the district's energy management system (EMS); troubleshoot issues and malfunctions of the EMS system; coordinate communications, resources and information to assure smooth, efficient and effective energy use and allocation.
- Monitor and repair district computer system classroom including smartboards, iPad carts, switches and servers.
- Confer with Director-MOT on priorities, special projects, preventive maintenance needs, schedules and work assignments and delegation of work; review and evaluate completed projects.
- Maintain and repair district lighting systems and fixtures; change LED bulbs.
- Install, maintain and repair security camera surveillance systems and related equipment.
- Perform duties assigned to the responsibilities of the Skilled Maintenance Worker position.
- Communicate with staff, other departments, vendors, contractors, service providers and outside agencies to exchange information, resolve issues and coordinate activities.
- Maintain maintenance shop and work areas in a safe, clean and orderly condition.

- Operate a computer and assigned software; drive a vehicle to conduct work.
- Assist other maintenance personnel in the performance of a variety of duties related to the building trades.
- Train and provide work guidance to assigned maintenance staff.
- Attend and participate in a variety of meetings and in-service trainings.

OTHER DUTIES:

- Perform related duties as assigned.
- Perform a variety of grounds maintenance and gardening duties in the beautification of assigned grounds and landscaped areas as directed.
- Oversee and coordinate the activities of other District personnel assigned to larger maintenance projects.

QUALIFICATIONS:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill and/or ability required. The work environment characteristics and physical demands described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Knowledge of:

- Principles and practices of training, leading and providing work guidance to other staff.
- Methods, tools, equipment, materials, methods and techniques used in general construction, electrical, maintenance and repair.
- HVAC equipment design, sizing, installation, maintenance and repair.
- Electrical switches, gears, high voltage panels and transformers.
- Principles, practices, standards and procedures involved in energy management systems (EMS) and energy conservation programs and troubleshooting techniques.
- Organizational energy requirements and programs for efficiently consuming energy.
- Programming of network equipment and IP addressing gateways.
- Operation and use of hand and power tools and specialized equipment.
- Technical aspects and building codes related to assigned trades including HVAC, EMS and other building trades.
- Installation of surveillance cameras, systems and programming.
- Installation and maintenance of water well equipment and sludge pumps.
- Proper methods of storing equipment, materials and supplies.
- Arithmetic calculations and measuring concepts applicable to the building trades.
- Appropriate safety precautions and procedures.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Record-keeping techniques.
- Proper lifting techniques.

Skills/Ability to:

- Lead and perform a variety of skilled maintenance, repair and construction duties in the maintenance of designated facilities, buildings and equipment.
- Establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships with others.
- Assist other maintenance personnel in the performance of a variety of duties related to the building trades.
- Inspect buildings, facilities, equipment and other related sites for operating efficiency, comfort level and compliance with applicable energy rules, regulations, policies and practices.
- Operate a variety of assigned tools, materials and equipment effectively and safely.
- Apply laws, rules, codes and regulations involved in assigned maintenance activities.
- Understand and follow oral and written directions.
- Read and work from plans, blue prints, sketches, specifications and diagrams.
- Plan and lay out work.
- Observe health and safety regulations and procedures.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Meet schedules and timelines.
- Understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- Train and provide work guidance to assigned staff.
- Work independently with little direction.

• Maintain various records related to work performed.

Education and Experience:

Any combination of experience and training that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities is:

- Graduation from high school or equivalent GED.
- Five years journey-level trade experience in the structural or mechanical trades including two years in a lead capacity.

Licenses, Certifications and other Requirements:

- Valid Class C California Driver's License.
- Valid and appropriate journey-level trade certifications related to HVAC, EMS or other assigned building trades.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

Work Environment:

- Indoor/Outdoor/Shop environment.
- Driving a vehicle to conduct work.
- Work evenings or variable hours.

Physical Demands:

- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate specialized equipment and tools.
- Hearing and speaking to exchange information.
- Seeing to read and perform assigned trade related functions.
- Lifting, carrying, pushing or pulling heavy objects.
- Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.
- Heavy physical labor.
- Bending at the waist, kneeling or crouching.
- Climbing ladders and working from heights.
- Standing for extended periods of time.

Hazards:

- Working around and with machinery having moving parts.
- Exposure to high voltage and electrical shock.
- Working at heights.
- Seasonal heat and cold or adverse weather conditions.
- Exposure to fumes, dust, odors, oil/grease, gases.
