JOB SUMMARY:

Under the direction of Maintenance Operations and Transportation, perform routine maintenance or servicing tasks in the maintenance, construction and repair of buildings, equipment, utilities and facilities; support other skilled maintenance personnel in the performance of a variety of duties related to the building trades; routinely perform gardening, custodial, and varied grounds maintenance work.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Performs a variety of general maintenance, construction and repair work on buildings, utilities and equipment.
- Supports skilled maintenance workers to perform standard maintenance, adjustments and repairs in various skilled trades including carpentry, electrical, painting, plumbing and water equipment, heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC), and others as assigned.
- Performs routine carpentry repairs on cabinets, shelves, doors and services door closures, articles and structures of wood, and hardware.
- Repairs plumbing valves, faucets, unstops plumbing fixtures and cleans traps.
- Repairs light switches, replaces light bulbs and fluorescent tubes and services fluorescent fixtures.
- Assembles, moves and arranges various furniture and equipment as directed; load and unload equipment and supplies.
- Repairs and refurbish cabinets, bookcases and a variety of classroom equipment; inspect, install and repair floor and ceiling tiles, roofs and shelving
- Repairs gates and fences, paints small areas/surfaces, mark athletic fields and performs custodial and/or grounds duties.
- Performs gardening and varied grounds maintenance work.
- Drives a vehicle to various district sites to conduct work.
- Attends to routine maintenance requests and work orders.
- Maintains routine records related to work orders assigned activities.

OTHER DUTIES:

- Performs related duties as assigned.
- Assists in emergency clean-up resulting from breakage, vandalism, spilling or illness.

- Basic record-keeping techniques.

- Perform a variety of routine maintenance, construction, grounds maintenance and repair work on buildings, utilities

- Assist other maintenance personnel in the performance of a variety of duties related to the building trades.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- Observe health and safety regulations and procedures.
- Operate and maintain hand and power tools and equipment.
