JOB SUMMARY:

Under general supervision of the Director of Maintenance, Operations and Transportation, performs necessary major and minor repair and maintenance of District's light and heavy rolling stock and performs other duties directly related to this job description.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Diagnosis and repairs mechanical defects in buses, trucks, tractors, fork lifts, mowers, spray rigs, automobiles, vans and other gas or diesel powered automotive and construction equipment.
- Tunes and rebuilds engines, adjusts, repairs or rebuilds brake, ignition and carburetor systems. Overhauls transmissions and differentials, drives and road tests vehicles.
- Responsible for carrying out a program of preventive maintenance and repair work on a variety of electric motors, automotive accessories and related equipment.
- Read and prepare schematics and diagrams.
- Orders parts and supplies, maintains diagnostic equipment and shop tools, responsible for time and equipment service records.
- Maintains safe and clean assigned work areas.

• Perform related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:
