TRANSPORTATION 2020-21

- Total student count for 2019-20 = 5,210 (including preschool)
- Total students that DO NOT use transportation = 4,707
- Total Regular Ed students that use transportation = 375
- Total Special Ed students that use transportation = 112
- Total NPS, Homeless and Foster students that use transportation = 16

Total students transported = 503

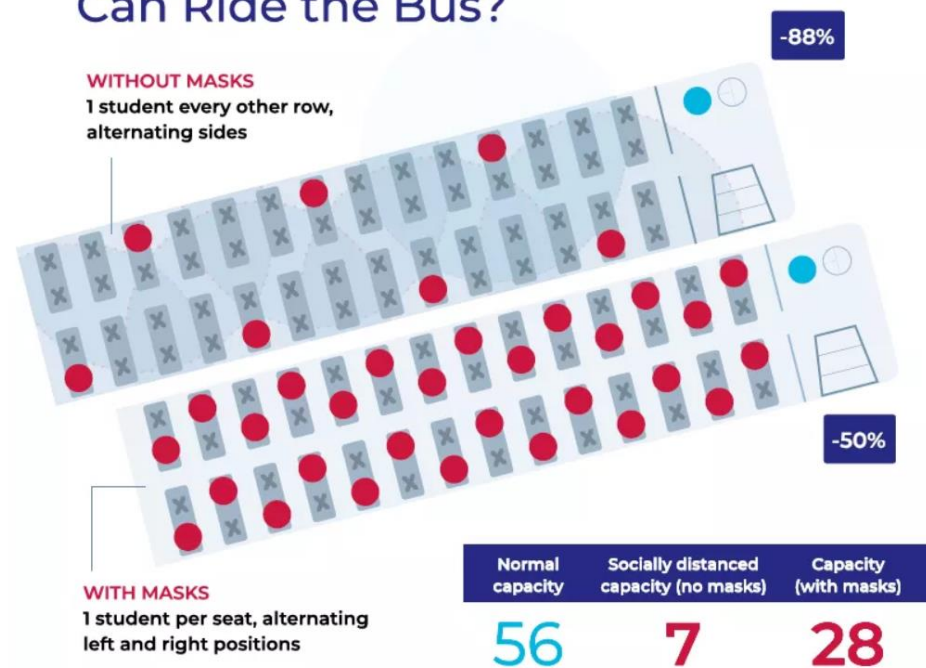

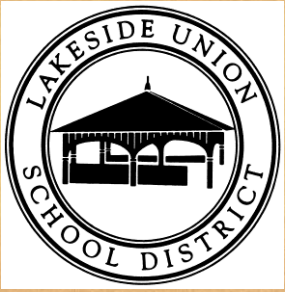

How Many Students Can Ride the Bus?

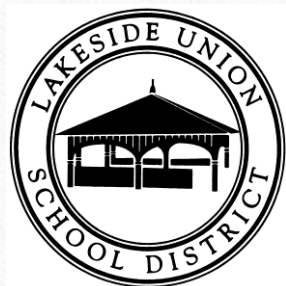

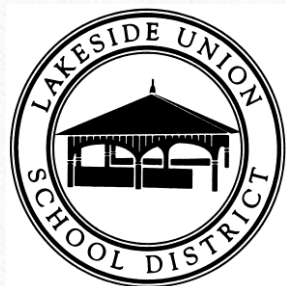

Consideration #1

Return Implementing the Most Current Social Distancing Guidelines

- Regular Ed - Only provide routes to Navy housing and Barona (potential waiting list)
- Special Ed - May need to use drivers from Regular Ed routes
- NPS, Homeless and Foster - May need to use drivers from Regular Ed routes
- No field trips

We currently have a county wide shortage of drivers so adding routes would be difficult, this may not be an option

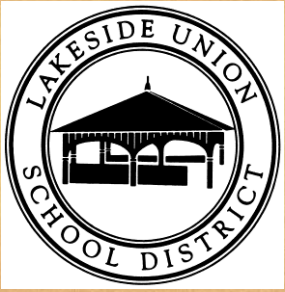


TRANSPORTATION 2020-21

Consideration #2

- Regular Ed - Suspend all routes until the social distancing has been lifted and full capacity transportation can be provided safely and then reevaluate Regular Ed transportation
- Special Ed - Use all drivers to transport students with special needs using the most current social distancing guidelines
- NPS, Homeless and Foster - Use all the drivers to transport students with special needs using the most current social distancing guidelines.
- No field trips
