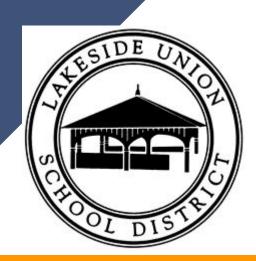

STATE ECONOMIC OUTLOOK



State Economic Outlook

- Governor Newsom highlights the volatile nature of California state revenues due to its progressive tax system
 - Postponement of personal income tax (PIT) and corporation tax returns until October means an estimated \$42 billion are not due to come until fall
- State revenues have softened since the Governor's Budget proposal in January that has increased the state's budget deficit from \$22.5 billion to \$31.5 billion



State Economic Outlook

- Marked slowing in the number of initial public offerings (IPOs), which can affect the state economy and revenues
- California is losing more residents than it is gaining, at all income levels
 - Since 2018, the net loss of higher-income residents has been starker than low-and middle-income residents
- Two-year and ten-year treasury yields is one of the strongest predictors of an impending economic recession
 - When the yield curve inverts, there is a two-thirds chance of a recession within a year and a 98% change within two years the curve has been inverted since the summer of 2022



State Economic Outlook

- A new 20% decline in the S&P 500 has impacted high income earners, which the state relies on for over nearly half its total revenue
- Interest rate hikes, persistent inflation, bank failures, and the debt ceiling fight in Washington D.C. all have the potential to add risk to the May Revision projected revenue picture
- Revenue projections were already an issue in January, but are worse in May and relies heavily on the accuracy of the Governor's broader economic assumptions

Ongoing Investments

- Statutory COLA 8.22%
 - ◆ LCFF
 - Categoricals
- Universal School Meals
- → Home-to-School Transportation
- → ELO-P

Proposed Reductions

- 2022-23 Learning Recovery
 Emergency Block Grant by 30%
- 2022-23 Arts, Music, Instructional Materials Discretionary Block Grant by 50%

Note: Both of these appropriations were part of the 2022-23 State Adopted Budget



Prop 28 - Arts & Music Program

Funded by 1% of Prop 98

Each year can fluctuate up or down as funds are dependent on Prop 98 revenues

Requirements:

Expenditure plan is required for each school site or preschool program

Submit and post an annual board-approved report detailing use of fund

Subject to annual audit beginning in 2023-24

LEAs must certify:

Supplement, not supplant existing funds

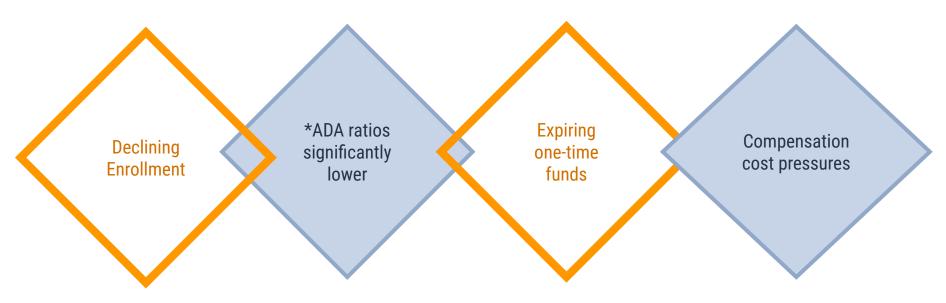
Be used for arts education, including a requirement to expend at least 80% of fund to employ staff for arts education instruction

Adhered to the 1% administrative expenses limit

At this time CDE is not responding to clarification questions on use of funds No audit guide has been provided

- ★ Prop 28
- ★ 2% property tax increase

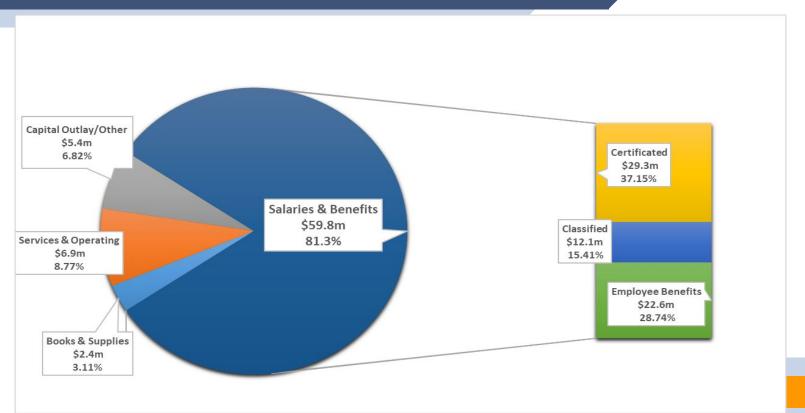

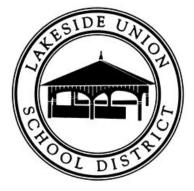
